

Arrest 72 After Bus Disturbance

A disturbance last night on a New Orleans Public Service Inc. bus led to the arrest of 72 passengers, booked with being loud and boisterous.

Most of the arrested persons were students or friends of students at Xavier University and about half of them were men, police said.

All but one of the 72, Fanny Carver, 17, a Dillard student, later were paroled for Dr. Albert W. Dent, Dillard president.

THE CARVER GIRL was booked with inciting a riot as well as disturbing the peace, police said.

Police arrested the group at S. Carrollton and Tulane after

the driver, Francis Roux, 36, 606 Tucker, Jefferson Parish, complained that the Negro passengers had removed the sign dividing white and Negro riders and had jeered at him when he remonstrated with them.

There was one white passenger on the bus at the time, police said.

There was no violence, Ptn. Edward Kennedy, one of the arresting officers, said.
